  - 1. No new avalanches reported today makes two days without new avalanche activity. Went out to view natural activity from the last
  - 2. Collection agreement is good to go. Found someone to fix the issue without correcting the SAM.gov problem but we need to fix that going forward. Grants and contracts are on a 45 day backlog. Brandon's ranger told them everything is good to go continue with expenditures and that will get sorted out. Unless we correct the SAM.gov problems,
